Gene Trisko is an energy economist and an environmental attorney. He has a B.A. in economics and politics from New York University (1972) and a J.D. from Georgetown University Law Center (1977). He has lectured on the Clean Air Act and climate change at The Pennsylvania State University and West Virginia University College of Law. He is the author of more than 30 articles on energy and environmental policy issues, and has testified before Congress and state legislatures on many occasions.

Mr. Trisko has represented the United Mine Workers in domestic and international environmental issues since 1985, including participation as an NGO at all major UN climate negotiations since the 1992 Rio Treaty. He also serves as General Counsel of Unions for Jobs and Environmental Progress, an association of eight national and international labor organizations, including the Boilermakers, the IBEW, railroad unions, and the United Mine Workers (www.ujep4jobs.org).

Gene served as an appointed member of U.S. EPA's Clean Air Act Advisory Committee from 2003 until 2010. In 2000 and again in 2007, he was appointed by the U.S. Department of State as a labor-industry NGO member of U.S. delegations negotiating air quality agreements with Canada.
